MINUTES MONTHLY ORONOCO TOWN BOARD MEETING APRIL 6, 2015

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The monthly Oronoco Town Board Meeting was called to order on April 6, 2015 at 7:00 PM by Chairman Mark Thein. Supervisors Neil Stolp, Richard Lyke and treasurer, Kim Stanton were present.

Richard Lyke made a motion to approve the March 2, 2015 minutes, Mark Thein seconded. Motion carried.

The order of agenda was ok as presented.

There was not an OPAC meeting-no report

The First Responders reported ten runs for March – seven Township and three city. Two of the First Responders have taken the storm watch training.

Bills totaling \$17,363.32 were presented for payment. Mark Thein made a motion to pay the bills and Neil Stolp seconded. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report in written form showed the year to date "Statement of Receipts, Disbursements and Balances" as of March 31, 2015: Receipts \$56,449.98 and Disbursements \$158,977.29 with an ending balance of \$348,331.46. Kim will be transferred \$100,000.00 from the Money Market account to a 6-month CD. Mark Thein made a motion to approve the treasurer's report as presented, Neil Stolp seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business: Sheila Craig reporting on Kings Park and Cedar Beach Kings Park:

Kings Park will need one more inspection before it is complete.

Cedar Beach:

- 18 of the 25 homes have signed the letters for approval of the sewer project.
- The appraisal from Blekpe Appraisal Services for the Guzinski property seemed to be higher than expected(approx \$78,000.00). Rather than wait until summer for a second appraisal, the Board discussed making Mr. Guzinski a reasonable offer. Mark Thein made a motion to submit a proposal of \$6,000.00 per acre on 4.12 acres (\$24,720.00).
 Neil Stolp seconded, motion carried 3-1. Mark will draw up the proposal and submit.
- There are new legal descriptions

Bids were submitted by: Envirotech, Quality Propane, Inc, Roberson Lime & Rock, Inc, Milestone Materials, Ron Haglund, and Schumacher Excavating. Neil Stolp made a motion to accept all bids, Mark Thein seconded. Motion carried 3-1. Mark Thein made a motion to make Roberson Lime & Rock the primary winter and summer provider with Milestone the secondary provider.
